

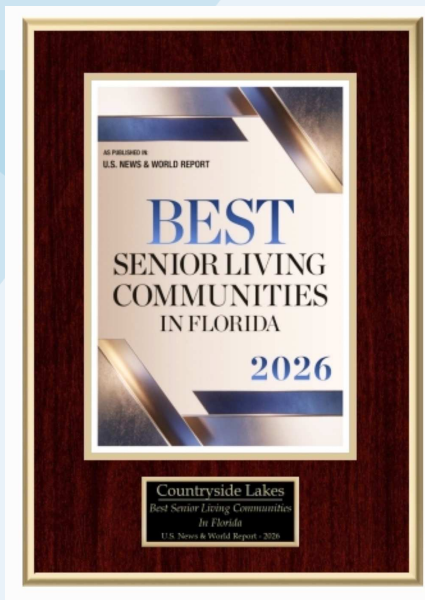

Despite being an accomplished bassoonist and pianist as a teen who was awarded a full scholarship to the prestigious Juilliard School of Music, she chose to pursue a career in nursing having been awarded multiple scholarships. Carolyn earned BS degrees from the College of Saint Teresa and Marquette University.

A college roommate introduced Carolyn to James Stuedli, a naval officer. Upon his discharge, they had a long and wonderful 63 years of marriage and three great children. Carolyn was a part time working mom who later became a Director of Nursing, Administrator, and VP of a Rehab and Memory Care company. She was active in Alzheimer's causes setting up two university research programs and testified before Congress.

When Jim's retirement brought them to the mountains of NC, she worked until the year 2000. Carolyn then parted the corporate world for Florida where Jim passed away five years ago.

Carolyn's journey has not been without trials and tribulations. She was diagnosed with a severe genetic back condition in her early forties that required three surgeries within a year. This left her paralyzed and she was told she would never walk again. With the loving support of her family, she spent two years in intense therapy and went from being bed bound to ultimately walking on her own and able to pursue the above career.

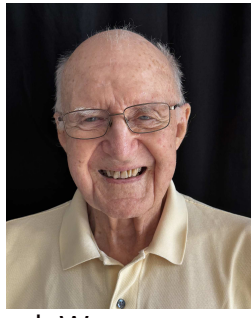

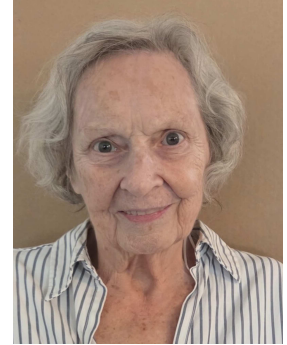
